

IMPORTANT NOTICE: PLACEMENT EXAMINATIONS CANCELLED FOR SEPTEMBER 2020 AND JANUARY 2021

Time:

Placement exams may be written either in the morning or afternoon <u>during the first week of classes</u> in September or January (cancelled for September 2020 and January 2021). Students may write any of the exams on any of the scheduled dates. However, students are required to register for the exams in advance.

- Morning exams are scheduled from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m.
- Afternoon exams are scheduled from 1:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m.

Location:

All exams will be held at the Engineering, Computer Science and Visual Arts Integrated Complex (EV building) – 1515 Sainte-Catherine Street West. Room location will be confirmed via email.

Registration deadline:

Students must register by filling out the registration form. At this time, there is no registration form due to the cancellation of the September 2020 and January 2021 Placement Examinations.

On the day of the exam:

Students are to arrive no later than 15 minutes before the start of the exam. Students must provide identification that bears both their photo and their signature, such as Concordia I.D. card, health insurance card, driver's license or passport. **Students will <u>NOT</u> be permitted to write without this identification.**

No materials are permitted during the placement exams, except approved calculators. For a list of approved calculators, please refer to the next page.

IMPORTANT NOTICE: PLACEMENT EXAMINATIONS CANCELLED FOR SEPTEMBER 2020 AND JANUARY 2021

IMPORTANT: Please note the information provided below is meant for the **Gina Cody School of Engineering** and **Computer Science** students only. Non-engineering and computer science students must contact their corresponding faculty regarding placement examination.

Placement exams have been developed as a means for newly admitted students of Concordia University to obtain recognition for enriched studies that they have completed in a secondary school outside the Province of Québec. Students who have successfully completed a secondary school course which covered material similar to the content of a first-year mathematics or science course at Concordia may request to write a placement exam for that course.

Placement exams are three (3) hour exams similar to the final examinations given in these courses. Students who are successful in the placement exam(s) may be awarded **credit or exemption** for the Concordia course(s). The following apply:

- Placement exams can be written only on the first week of classes in the fall (September) and winter (January) terms. At this time, the September 2020 and January 2021 Placement Examinations have been cancelled.
- 2. Only students who have been admitted to a degree or certificate program at the University for Summer, Fall or Winter may request to write the exams. Independent and Visiting Students are not eligible.
- 3. A request to write a placement exam will not be considered after one year from the date of the student's first registration in the degree or certificate program for which the course is a prerequisite.
- 4. Students may not request to write a placement exam more than once in any one course.
- 5. Students may not write a placement exam in a course for which they have previously registered either at Concordia or at any other post-secondary institution.
- 6. Students may not write a placement exam in a course for which they have previously registered/completed its prerequisite either at Concordia or at any other post-secondary institution. For example, a student who have registered/completed MATH 203 may not write the placement exam in MATH 205.
- 7. Students may not write a placement exam in a course for which they have previously written an advanced placement exam, an advanced level examination, an International Baccalaureate examination or other similar examination.
- 8. Students may not write a placement exam for a course of a lower level than one already attempted. For example, a student who wrote a placement exam for MATH 205 may not subsequently write an exam in MATH 203.
- 9. Students may not write a placement exam for a course of a higher level than one already failed for which it is a prerequisite. For example, a student who failed the placement exam for MATH 203 may not subsequently write an exam in MATH 205.
