### Admission Requirements

To be eligible to add a Minor in Business Studies, you must:

1. Have a Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) of 2.50 or above
2. Have achieved an average of 2.70 (B-) or better in MATH 208 and MATH 209 (students who have received an exemption for MATH 208 must achieve a minimum grade of 2.70 in MATH 209, and vice versa).
3. Have completed all four of the John Molson prerequisites and have all grades posted on your student record. The prerequisites are:
  - ECON 201 (Microeconomics), ECON 203 (Macroeconomics), MATH 208 (Linear Algebra) and MATH 209 (Cal I)
4. Starting fall 2024, CEGEP students admitted with exemptions in MATH 208 and MATH 209 will need to complete COMM 213 a grade of C- or better and COMM 214 with a grade of B- or better.
