





- Pick a database
- Search
  - Modify search with limits (date range, language, document type)
  - Possibly use subject terms/subject headings/thesaurus

Go to CLUES Library Catalogue and search by journal title







## Direct quotation

In response to rapid metropolitan expansion, urban renewal projects sought "an order in which more significant kinds of conflict, more complex and intellectually stimulating kinds of disharmony, may take place" (Mumford 485).

### Common mistakes in MLA

- Both direct quotations and paraphrased text need to be attributed
- Punctuation, indentation, spacing and italicization
- Author's name format (is it a middle name or a last name?)
- Multiple publisher locations (New York, London, Paris)
- Citing a work within a book
- Alphabetical order by author's last name
- 2<sup>nd</sup> work by same author, use "---."
- Citing websites, course packs, and multimedia
