

Library services

- Circulation = borrowing books
- Reference = research help
- Collections = where are the books on dance?
- Technology = printing, scanning, laptop loans



Circulation

- Student ID card = library card
- After-hours: self-checkout machine
- 30 items for 3 weeks, renewals x 3
- Holds shelf
- Course reserves: find your required textbooks
- Some items do not circulate



BCI card

Borrow in-person from other Québec university libraries (McGill, U de M...)



- Takes 5 minutes
- Go to Circulation desk with student ID
- Free

Interlibrary loans

Get books from other libraries around the world

- Also called COLOMBO
- Free
- Fill in online request form



Call numbers demystified in our YouTube tutorial






A call number starting with "GN 517" would be in the preceding row.

- Borrow laptop (1 day) or iPad (3 days)
- Add cash to your ID card for printing, copying, scanning
- Free book scanners



DEFINITIONS

Primary vs. secondary sources

Primary source

- Produced at the time of the event
- First-hand evidence
- Interview
- Diary, correspondence
- Video of a performance

Secondary source

- Written after the fact
- Interprets or analyzes the event
- Review
- Academic essay

Scholarly vs. nonscholarly

Use <u>Ulrich's Periodical Directory</u> to see if a journal is scholarly or not

- Author is expert in their field
- Specialized audience
- Academic language
- Contains a bibliography

Peer review

- Stamp of approval
- Process to vet publication
- Article reviewed by other experts
- Peer Review in 3 Minutes

Types of sources

- Monograph: book on a single subject
- Ebook
- Periodical: magazines, journals, newspapers

- Anthology/edited work: multiple essays gathered in one book
- Article (journal, magazine or newspaper)

 Media (images, video, diagrams)



E-journals search tool

Can't find an article? Search by journal name, then drill down to the correct date/issue.



Use AND, OR and NOT to combine keywords

Use quotation marks to find an exact phrase

Citation styles MLA, APA, Chicago

Why cite?

- Credit other people's work
- Reader can find the passage you quoted
- Avoid plagiarism

MLA 7th or 8th edition

In-text vs. bibliographic citation

Example:

"He was obeyed," writes Joseph Conrad of the company manager in *Heart* of *Darkness*, "yet he inspired neither love nor fear, nor even respect" (87).

- . 12 Point Font (Times New Roman)
- . One Inch Margins: Top, Bottom, Left, Right
- Double-spaced Entries

- Title
- Place of publication


