he religion of Islam has been a topic heavily discussed both in the classroom and in the media since the attacks on the Pentagon and the World Trade Center on September 11, 2001. Significant attention has been given to examine Islam, the tenets associated with the faith, and its relations to democracy and human rights. With this attention has come much discussion surrounding the level of respect Islam gives to the rights of individuals that include, but are not limited to, women's rights and religious minor-

Empire, we cover various country politics, as well as the role of outside powers in the region (that include Britain, France, the former Soviet Union, and the United States). Furthermore, we study thematic political topics such as "Political Islam and Islam ist Movements" (specifically looking at the origins of Al-Qaeda, the Muslim Brotherhood, and Hezbollah), along with other topics that include democracy and the Middle East.
