### SERGIU POPA, ACCORDIONIST – COMPLETE BIO

#### Education:

1985- Began informal study of music in 1985 at the age of 4 with his father and uncle (professional wedding musicians), in Moldova.
1989-1996 Valerii Poleakov school of music
1996-2000 Stefan Neaga College of Music, Kishinev, Moldova (1996-2000), diploma in musical performance (classical and traditional folk), orchestral conducting and music teaching.
2000-2002 Conservatory of Music in Kishinev

#### Performance projects and collaborations:

From a young age, Sergiu performed traditional folk music and Roma (Gypsy) music with his father **Ion Popa**, a renowned accordionist in Moldova, at weddings.

After immigrating to Canada, Sergiu started performing with his partner, Jessica Gal, in 2003 as **Shatra Duo**, often accompanied by other musicians, including the famous Romanian violinist **Carmen Piculeata**. The duo became the core of the **Sergiu Popa Ensemble**, a multicultural 5-piece group performing Balkan fusion. First discovered at the Musique Multi-Montreal Festival in 2004, the Ensemble began touring the Quebec festival circuit. They performed extensively at festivals and concert venues throughout Canada. The Sergiu Popa Ensemble opened for **Emir Kusturica and the No Smoking Orchestra** at the Metropolis in 2012 as part of the Montreal Jazz Festival, and Sergiu performed with **Fanfare Ciocarlia** at the Rialto in Montreal, as a special guest in 2012. He is also playing quite often with romanian star Dan Armeanca. Also collaborates quite often with Oliver Rajamani (multi-instrumentalist from Texas).

On international scene he has performed with great artists like: Kalman Balogh (cymbalom Hungary), Muamer Ketenceoglu (Turkey), Theodossi Spassov (Bulgaria), Adam Stinga (Moldova) Miron Rafajlovic (Bosnia-Spain) etc,

He got invited to audition for Cirque du Soleil and also for Dubai Expo 2020. Sergiu is invited often to play in San Francisco (California for Kolo Festival, Martishor Festival, Cotati Accordion festival, Balkan Night Northwest Seattle, New York-Drom.

Sergiu also collaborated extensively with the re-known Russian 7-string guitar legend **Vadim Kolpakov**, as part of the **Via Romen** ensemble. For example, they performed with Svetlana Portnyansky at the Dolly Parton's **Dollywood Festival of Nations** throughout March 19 – April 18, 2016.

As a soloist, Sergiu has been invited to join various other projects such as *OktoEcho* and the Grammy Award-nominated project **Yiddish Glory** (with which he has toured in Toronto, Vienna and Czechoslovakia).

He also is a part of San Francisco project Trio Dulce & Amar, led by Balder ten Cate.

Sergiu has performed as a musician and cast member in several community and professional musical theatre productions at the Segal Centre for Performing Arts: **Tales From** 

**Odessa** (2014), **The Angel and The Sparrow** (2018) and **Indecent** (2019). For the latter production, Sergiu's role has been nominated for a META award (see below). At the moment he represents Roland Canada electric accordions. He also performed for George Soros's wedding in USA.

2022 he released the album of his band Taraf Syriana in Montreal-Toronto.

- 2021 he formed a duo group with his wife, accordion and cello touring through Canada and Europe.
- 2022 he tours quite often within Canada (Montreal-Toronto-Vancouver) with one of his music ensemble Taraf Syriana.

- Taught masterclasses in accordion and East European music at music camps such as CAMMAC and KlezKanada (Quebec), Django in June (Massachusetts) and the EEFC's Balkan Camps (California and New York).
